## From the Pastor's Desk....

Hello Friends!

Christ is Risen! He is Risen, Indeed! What a joy to be sharing this message with you post-Easter. We're now in the time of the church year called "Eastertide." This is the longest official season of the church, clocking in at 50 days. (For any church nerds or just interested people, the actual longest period of time is "Ordinary Time," which begins after Pentecost Sunday and continues until Christ the King Sunday—which is May through November. Eastertide is all about rejoicing and celebrating the resurrection of Jesus Christ, as well as focusing on the very early church. In those first few years after Christ's resurrection, the church grew exponentially as the Gospel message was shared.

This year, from now until Pentecost—on May 19, 2024—I will be following the lectionary so I won't be doing a sermon series. Instead, we'll be seeing where the apostles go and where the early church gets its beginnings. We'll have one reading from Acts and then another reading, normally from one of the Gospels.

The Book of Acts is a fascinating book because it fills in the gap between the end of the four Gospels and the letters (fancy church word is epistles) written by the apostles, mainly Paul and his direct followers. Think of Romans, 1 and 2 Corinthians, 1 and 2 Timothy, Galatians, 1, 2, and 3 John.

Interestingly enough, Luke and Acts were written by the same person and were written to go hand-in-hand. Acts tells us what was going on while the letters that we now have as part of our Bible were being written. As a history buff, I love that Acts is part of our canon because it sets the rest of the New Testament in a context. Because otherwise, we're just reading people's mail without understanding anything that was happening between the various churches.

Here's a snapshot from Acts so you can see what I mean: *"Now in the church at Antioch there were prophets and teachers: Barnabas, Simeon who was called Niger, Lucius of Cyrene, Manaen a member of the court of Herod the ruler, and Saul. While they were worshiping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' Then after fasting and praying they laid their hands on them and sent them off. So, being sent out by the Holy Spirit, they went down to Seleucia; and from there they sailed to Cyprus."* (Acts 13:1-4).

We get from these verses that people are worshiping Jesus in Antioch which is modern day Turkey. And then, two of the leaders in Antioch were sent farther away to Cyprus, which is part of Greece. The message of Jesus Christ is spreading through the Mediterranean. As a refresher, Saul is also known as Paul. His name is changed later in Chapter 13.

Hopefully, you're able to join worship to find out more about the early church, as well as the ways we can incorporate this into our worshiping lives today. Only God knows what's in store, so we'll pray for the very best!

# Recipe

Pastor Katherine made this dip for coffee hour, and several people requested that it be shared in the newsletter:

## Garlicky White Bean Dip (from *The Daniel Plan*)

### Ingredients

- 1 (15 oz.) can cannellini or great northern white beans, rinsed
- 1 Tablespoon extra-virgin olive oil
- 2 Tablespoons water
- 4 small garlic cloves, crushed
- Juice of 1 lemon
- 1 teaspoon paprika

### Directions

In a food processor, pulse beans with olive oil and water until smooth. Add crushed garlic, lemon juice, and paprika and pulse until creamy texture is achieved. Serve with your favorite raw vegetables (or crackers).

## Local Food Pantry News




Now the whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all. There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and brought the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need. There was a Levite, a native of Cyprus, Joseph, to whom the apostles gave the name Barnabas (which means "son of encouragement"). He sold a field that belonged to him, then brought the money, and laid it at the apostles' feet.

But a man named Ananias, with the consent of his wife Sapphira, sold a piece of property; with his wife's knowledge, he kept back some of the proceeds, and brought only a part and laid it at the apostles' feet. "Ananias," Peter asked, "why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit and to keep back part of the proceeds of the land? While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, were not the proceeds at your disposal? How is it that you have contrived this deed in your heart? You did not lie to us but to God." Now when Ananias heard these words, he fell down and died. And great fear seized all who heard of it.
