From Pastor Amy's Desk....

"the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his Glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth."

(John 1:14 - NRSV)



Christmas is one of my favorite times of year. Even with the added stress of parties and shopping and baking, there tends to be a collective feeling of joy and hope that isn't always felt during other parts of the year. Frederick Buechner writes, "At Christmas time it is hard even for the unbeliever not to believe in something, if not in everything. ... For a moment or two, the darkness of disenchantment, cynicism, doubt, draw back at least a little, and all the usual worldly witcheries lose something of their power to charm."

It's hard not to enjoy a holiday that puts at its center a baby. Babies, particularly one that is not our responsibility to raise into a mature adult, are so darn cute. When we think about it, babies don't demand much from us. All a baby wants is to be loved; held, fed, and kept dry. When we look into the face of a baby, we see unrestricted love and limitless hope. At Christmas we celebrate a birth and a baby unlike any other. Jesus is a very special baby; with his birth the whole course of human history was changed. But we can be afraid of the changes Christ is bringing about and try to control God by perpetually keeping Jesus in the manger.

It is easy for us to want to hold onto Christmas for as long as possible. We know that in a few short months, this baby will ask us to leave everything and to follow him. He will challenge us to give up our worldly possessions, securities, and values we cling to. If we choose to follow him, the journey will take us to the dark day of Good Friday. As along as Jesus stays the baby in the manger, he asks us nothing harder than to love him and accept his love.

This Christmas, I encourage and challenge each one of us to: Take Christ Out of the Manger. Let Christ grow up, and let us grow in Christ.

- The next Session meeting will be held on **Tuesday, December 17, 2019**, at 6:30 p.m.




My work week is Sunday-Thursday, but, as always, I am available for pastoral emergencies.

Deacons' Fund Offering

A part of the Deacons' ministry is our monthly Deacons' Fund Offering, which assists charitable, nonprofit organizations. The Board of Deacons would like to thank everyone who donated to Skylands Outreach Depot in November.

Our Deacons' Fund for December is People Help. People Help of Sussex County is a nonprofit, all volunteer agency, and has been inexistence since 1976 at the request of the Division of Social Services and the churches across our county. For 37 years, People Help has been able to provide one-time, immediate aid for emergency assistance of residents who do not financially qualify for help from any other agency. They have no office, no paid staff. Their volunteers answer calls from 9-5, Monday through Friday, responding to the clients who have reached out to them directly, or have been referred by various other agencies who have been unable to meet immediate needs.

Our Deacons Fund for January is The Center for Prevention and Counseling. Located in Newton, The Center is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization which was begun in 1974 as the Alcohol Information Center of Sussex County. Over the years, the agency has expanded its mission to include other drugs, as well as to address the disease of addiction, by dedicating itself to the prevention of substance abuse and dependency through education, information dissemination, referrals, advocacy and counseling. In 2005, The Center became licensed to provide outpatient and intensive outpatient counseling to people with substance abuse and mental health issues. The agency's mission has continued to expand, as it focuses on building stronger families and healthy adolescents, helping to reduce poverty, reducing child abuse, promoting mental health and substance abuse recovery, and preventing violence, suicide and bullying in Sussex County. The mission of The Center for Prevention and Counseling is "to promote health, hope and recovery among all people by fostering a community in which individuals and families thrive." Inclement Weather/Emergency Church Closing Practice



The Session and Pastor of the First Presbyterian Church of Sussex, NJ, have agreed that church will remain open for Sunday and regularly-scheduled services despite inclement weather and forecasts of pending weather conditions. Individual members of the congregation are asked to use their own discretion regarding their attendance on any particular worship day due to illness, road conditions, or other related weather or natural events. In the event that the Governor declares a "State of Emergency" and requests that the average member of the public stay off the roads, or a foot or more of snow is

predicted by the local weather bureau, or if the heat and or electricity for the church goes off prior to the service, then every effort will be made to contact members of the congregation to cancel that particular worship service.

If one or more of the three conditions develop from the previous statement forcing the church service to be cancelled, then the Pastor will activate the church-wide phone chain maintained by the Hospitality Ministry Group. Every effort will be made to contact members of the church to advise them of a cancellation and the reason for the cancellation.

In the event that the Pastor is out of town, the decision to cancel service for one of the three reasons stated above will be made by an available member of Session starting with the Building & Grounds elder in consultaion with the Clerk of/to Session, then proceeding to the President of the Trustees, and then other members of Session.

In the event that a guest preacher cannot attend service due to last-minute circumstances such as illness, poor road condition, etc., then the liturgist for that day will conduct as much of the worship service as possible with the inclusion of a hymn sing and a previously-prepared, interactive meditation on a Scripture passage developed for just such an occasion and left in the pulpit in a folder by the Pastor. If the Music Director is unavailable due to illness and or emergency circumstances, then the service will proceed with hymns being sung with the assistance of the Divine Spirit.

If inclement weather is predicted for a worship service, it should be understood that the Hospitality Committee will not provide refreshments following the service.

Thank you for your understanding. We have attempted to address most situations that could develop and provide some drection, but please remember that safety and caution are always our first prioirity. (Approved 4/21/2015.)
