From the Pastor's Desk....

Happy Advent! Merry Christmas! Happy New Year!

It's the most wonderful time of the year! At least it truly is for me. (And I really hope you sang—out loud or in your head—the first sentence of the pastor's note. If you didn't, go ahead and take another stab at it now!) I love Advent and Christmas.

I love the feeling in the air as houses, storefronts, and town squares get all dolled up in their winter finery! People are generally jolly, and kids are excited beyond all comprehension. There's just something in the air around this time of year. I'm guessing you understand the feeling I'm talking about.



And yet, this time of holidays and special celebration can also be a very hard time for people—people going through grief, no matter how long ago the death was. People who aren't near their families, so the celebrations seem less exciting. People who don't have a stable income and either make great sacrifices or get into a lot of debt to bring joy to their children come Christmas morning. People who just go without.

There are plenty of reasons for people to not be thrilled and overjoyed around Christmas time. And, when we look around and see the state of things here on earth, I think we can all understand that things aren't ideal. We proclaim the waiting for Christ's birth and then we rejoice at His coming to us in the form of a tiny baby.

And then we wait—we wait for Jesus to return, for a complete restoration and transformation of this world. The thing is, as we wait—we don't sit idly by. God calls us to serve others and to give back from what we do have.

And friends, we sure have a lot. Just being citizens of this country, we have so much. If you're looking for an easy and meaningful way to give back during this Advent, Christmas, and New Year time, I suggest looking into participating in a reverse Advent Calendar.

A reverse Advent Calendar gives you day by day instructions on things to collect to donate to those in need. This is a way to easily participate in giving back and building our generosity muscles. It shows us how doing a little something every day does make a huge impact for those with less. I've included an example of one in this newsletter.

1 Timothy 6:18-19 is a good reminder for us as we get wrapped up in this gift-giving season—
"They are to do good, to be rich in good works, generous, and ready to share, thus storing up for
themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of the life that
really is life." The money spent on gifts is not nearly as important as the heart behind the giving.

Our culture loves to equate expensive gifts with higher importance, but I promise you that's not the case. Instead, it's the heart of WHY we give. The WHY of showing God's love to the world: to those we know and those we don't.

Friends, remember the true meaning of Christmas—that Christ is born into the world to save the world, redeem the world, and restore the world. May we live into this change and be agents of this change in our communities today.




Annual Report




Local Food Pantry News

Family Promise of Sussex County

Dear First Presabyterian Church of Sussex,

On behalf of Family Promise of Sussex County, I would like to thank you for your donation of toiletries, food, and cleaning supplies valued at \$200.00 on November 3, 2021.

Your commitment to helping homeless families in our community is incredibly kind and sincerely appreciated. We are on the verge of a historic housing crisis once the moratorium on evictions is lifted. In a recent report on the potential impacts of COVID-19 related evictions, it was determined that 40% of NJ renter households would be unable to pay their rent. It is estimated that the eviction rate, once the moratorium is lifted, will be 600% higher than prior to the pandemic. This means that upwards of 419,000 NJ households will be at risk. With unemployment hovering above 7.5% in New Jersey, many of those facing eviction will have few options beyond a friend's couch or on the streets. It is because of the generosity of donors like you that we can continue to provide assistance to at-risk and homeless families and individuals during this time.

Each year Family Prmoise continues to advance its mission of working with families to overcome barriers to self-sufficiency and advocating for local affordable houseing solutions. Through our Emergency Shelter, Supported Housing, Rapid Rehousing, and Men's Day Programs, we have seen many lives changed for the better.

The goal of Family Promise is to continue to make a difference in the lives of homeless families. With the help of donations from supporters such as you we will continue to see improvements in eliminating homelessness.
