From the Pastor's Desk....

Happy first anniversary! We made it through our first year of ministry together! So many exciting things happened, and I'm still so grateful to be your pastor. It's my deepest prayer that you are thankful that I'm here, too.

With our first year behind us, it's important to look at my goals from my very first pastor's note. I included three:

- 1. **To Get to Know You** I've met many of you, though I still have plenty of people to get to know in a deeper way. If we didn't connect in this first year of ministry—believe me, I want to get to know you more!
- 2. **To Get to Know the Community** I met with the other pastors in the area for our two virtual services, and I introduced myself to some of the other non-profits in Sussex and into Newton. I still want to do better with the greater Sussex community. If you have any ides of events where the church can be present, please let me know!
- 3. **Expand Congregational Service Opportunities** This goal of mine was the least practiced—and I hope to change that this year. COVID colored this goal, since various service opportunities for group service didn't restart in a safe way during 2021. I'm going to continue to be on the lookout for chances to expand this year.

Those were my goals and how I did on them. For this coming year, my goals are to continue to expand on these same parameters. We have a foundation built together—built upon rock as Christ suggests for us as believers to build our lives upon.

The rock we're built upon is a shared desire to grow as followers of Jesus Christ for our own spiritual benefit and for the benefit of the entire community where we find ourselves. It's through Christ alone that we can strive to have this spiritual growth.

Part of the growth is discovery (and rediscovery) of our foundations of ministry—and we're doing this in the current sermon series that will continue through February 20, 2022. Come learn about Christ's seven foundations of ministry and to think about your own/our own. The four covered in January were: baptism, the miracle of hospitality, how things can seem great...until they don't. And the three in February look at finding friends in ministry, figuring out your elevator pitch, and teaching the foundations of your faith.



Session Highlights

Session met on December 21st. The following items were discussed:





- The Per Capita amount due per member will remain at \$40.00 for 2022.
- The Presbyterian Women's Group made over \$700 at their Cookie & Bread Walk on December 18th.
- The Presbyterian Women's Group will hold their Annual Soup Sale by pre-order only.
- Ruling Elder Jason Touw and Clerk to Session Charles Bates presented options on repaving the parking lot. This will be discussed at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation on January 23rd.
- The 2022 Budget continues to need tweaks. We are close to presenting the Budget to our congregation.
- Stewardship is never over. We need your financial support.
- Ruling Elder Sharon Alheidt reported that Fellowship after worship will continue as it is presently being done.
- Pastor Katherine's Terms of Call have been approved for 2022.
- Ruling Elder Mike Kosco reported an average of 41 people attending church, with an average of eight on the ZOOM platform. He wants to work with Ruling Elder Ashley Ziccardi on scheduling Acolytes starting, hopefully, in January.
- The membership rolls are being worked on.
- The next regular Session meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **January 18**, **2022**, at 6:30 p.m., on the ZOOM platform.

Session met on January 18, 2022. The following items were discussed:

- The 2022 Budget was approved. It will be presented at the Annual Meeting of the Congregation on January 23, 2022.
- Pastor Katherine will begin a seven-week sermon series entitled, "Foundations of Ministry."




2022 Calendars



Deacons' Fund Offering



A part of the Deacons' ministry is our monthly Deacons' Fund Offering, which assists charitable, nonprofit organizations. The Board of Deacons would like to thank all those who donated to Father John's Animal House, our Deacons' Fund recipient for December; and the Center for Prevention and Counseling, our Deacons' Fund recipient for January.

Our Deacons' Fund recipient for February is Free Clinic Newton. It is a 501(c)(3) charity which provides free medical services to people who are low-income, uninsured, or unable to afford health care elsewhere. Staffed by physicians and nurses with a wide range of medical skills who volunteer their time and talents, Free Clinic Newton provides basic eye care, urgent and chronic care, minor procedures, triage assessments, diagnostic testing, and referral for some surgical procedures. Low-cost or free medications (never narcotics) are also made available to patients. The Clinic is also an additional way for the poor and homeless to access community social services, food and clothing banks, and recovery opportunities. Because the health care is offered at no cost, Free Clinic Newton relies on community donations and volunteer doctors, nurses, and citizens to make this important service possible.
