From the Pastor's Desk....

Hello Dear Church!

February is a transition month—you may not think that right away, and yet I assure you it is! **February 1**st marks the beginning of my third year as your pastor (which is a dear joy to me). It also marks the transition into the church season of Lent, which begins on Ash Wednesday on **February 22, 2023**.

We'll also be transitioning from our first sermon series of 2023 to our second. Our first series, "A New Vision," ends on **Sunday, February 12**th; our next series begins on Ash Wednesday and is called, "A Time to Grow."



I'll be following a book by the same name, *A Time to Grow: Lenten Lessons from the Garden to the Table* by Kara Eidson—a United Methodist pastor in the greater Kansas City area. The series will connect not just the growth of food (garden to table), but also how cultivating our faith makes for a richer life of following Christ. The book has all kinds of lovely devotions that you can do each day, if you'd like to purchase the book.

Here's a quote I loved from the introduction to *A Time to Grow*: "Within this culture, we have lost one of the uniting factors of what makes us human: the simple act of breaking bread together. Journeying through the season of Lent with this in mind, we can slow down, move through the painstaking process of growth, and end together with great feasting and celebration of the resurrection on Easter morning" (Edison, 4).

Since February is a month of transition, here's a quick look at some of the special things happening in February:

- 1. **Sunday, February 12**th, after church—The Annual Soup Sale is happening, and it's back to its pre-COVID form. Find more details in the newsletter! Thank you to all our volunteers who are preparing the yummy soup for this wonderful event!
- 2. **Thursday**, **February 16**th, at 6:30 p.m., at The Presbyterian Church of Morristown: A special lecture with author Lisa Miller, who will be speaking about her book, *The Spiritual Child*. You can attend the lecture in person OR via livestream. Find more information in the newsletter.
- 3. **Wednesday**, **February 22**nd, at 7:00 p.m.—Our Ash Wednesday Service; in the sanctuary and on ZOOM. Mark the beginning of your Lenten season with this service, which will be focused on "soil" and will end with bestowing the ash cross for those who'd like to participate.
- 4. Ordination/Installation of the new officers (Elders and Deacons) will also take place on a Sunday in February, but I'm not sure which one at this time. Be on the lookout to support our new class of leaders for the church.

May you all find peace and love in your lives as we move through February! And welcome to our third year of ministry together! I'm thrilled to see what God has in store for us during this year of ministry together.



Worshiping In Person Update





The Spiritual Child



Pastor Katherine is thrilled to extend the invitation on behalf of the Presbytery team she's part of to the lecture by Dr. Lisa Miller about her book *The Spiritual Child*. Dr. Miller is Professor and Founder of the Spirituality Mind Body Institute at Teachers College, Columbia University. A graduate of Yale and University of Pennsylvania, she is a leading national expert in spirituality, health and thriving in development.

The Presbyterian Church of Morristown is hosting Dr. Miller on **Thursday**, **February 16**, **2023** at 6:30 p.m. to delve into the importance of faith in a child's life. Her book, *The Spiritual Child*, presents the next big idea in psychology: the science and the power of

spirituality. She explains the clear, scientific link between spirituality and health and shows that children who have a positive, active relationship to spirituality:

- are 40% less likely to use and abuse substances
- are 60% less likely to be depressed as teenagers
- are 80% less likely to have dangerous or unprotected sex
- have significantly more positive markers for thriving including an increased sense of meaning and purpose, and high levels of academic success.



Our Prayer Shawl Ministry has been sending prayers and love in the form of beautiful knitted, crocheted, or quilted shawls to people in need of physical, emotional, or spiritual comfort. The shawl maker begins with prayers and blessings for the recipient, and keeps these thoughts in mind throughout the creative process. Our shawls are delivered with a message expressing the feelings of love and comfort with which they were made. If you

know anyone who could benefit from a prayer shawl, please call Janet (973-875-9252) or see her after worship. If you would like to create these beautiful shawls, a 20 x 60-inch rectangular shawl requires five skeins of yarn. If you don't knit, crochet, or sew, or don't have the time, you can purchase yarn or donate funds for materials.
