#### From the Pastor's Desk....

Hello Friends!

I can't believe it's already been three years of partnership in ministry! I am so honored to be called your pastor. The time has gone so quickly for me, and I am thrilled to see what God has in store of our fourth year of ministry together.

This month is the start of Lent, the time in the church calendar when we prepare our hearts and minds for Holy Week, especially for the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday. Many people honor Lent by giving something up.



This year, Ash Wednesday is on Valentine's Day, so if you're giving up chocolate, make sure to tell your spouse early so they don't buy you a chocolate heart that will just sit there tempting you for the six and a half weeks of Lent!

To mark Lent with our church family, we will be offering a few things:

- 1. Ash Wednesday Service on **February 14**<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the church and on ZOOM.
- 2. An Ecumenical Book Discussion Group through six weeks of Lent. There is a ZOOM group and an in-person group. The ZOOM group will meet on **Wednesdays at 12 noon (starting February 14**<sup>th</sup>), and the in-person group will meet on **Thursdays at 12 noon (stating February 15**<sup>th</sup>) in the fellowship room of our church. More information is in our newsletter.
- 3. The pastors will be joining together for a Maundy Thursday Service, as we've done for the past many years. More info will come about this in March.
- 4. Good Friday Service on **March 29**<sup>th</sup>, 7:00 p.m., at the church and on ZOOM.
- 5. Easter Sunday Service on March 31<sup>st</sup>, 10:30 a.m., at the church and on ZOOM.

I hope you're able to come to some of these special offerings for Lent. And that you listen for however the Holy Spirit is guiding you to mark Lent in our own lives. I find that I really like adding something into my spiritual life in Lent rather than just taking something away. To me, it adds a richness to this 46-day period of time.

You might have just read that last sentence and thought, "But Pastor Katherine, I thought Lent was 40 days?" and I'd respond by saying, yep. That's the traditional count of days because Sundays don't count as fasting days, because every Sunday is a mini-resurrection day and therefore, isn't a day to fast but to feast.

I hope you enjoyed those fun facts for this newsletter note. And I hope you take to heart the opportunity to mark Lent in your spiritual life this year. For our spiritual growth is an incredibly important part of our overall health.

In Psalm 25:4-5, the psalmist writes, "Make me to know your ways, O Lord; teach me your paths. Lead me in your truth and teach me, for you are the God of my salvation; for you I wait all day long." May this Lenten season bring this to fruition within you and within all of us as part of this church community.

- Our total Per Capita for 2024 is \$4,335. We ask each member to pay their "dues" of \$42.50.

#### **Lenten Book Discussion Group**

This year, the pastors in Sussex and Wantage are joining together to offer a community-wide Lenten Book Group Discussion. The discussion will be based around Kate Bowler's brand-new book, *Have a Beautiful, Terrible Day*, and will meet weekly on ZOOM and in person. You do not need to purchase or read the book to be part of the discussion group, but it is likely to be helpful to frame the discussion overall. The group will look at what it means to follow Jesus through the ups and downs of our days, which will be perfully help us to share all aspects of our lives, not just the picture, perfect of

# Why Per Capita?

Per Capita exists as a way for all Presbyterians to share costs that belong to the whole church and to give meaning to the interdependent nature of Presbyterian polity. For 2024, each member's contribution is \$42.50

Per Capita is part of the glue that holds Presbyterians together. It exists to allow the whole church to share equitably in those things that make us Presbyterian: our theological identity, our connectedness as communities of faith, our core structures that keep us together as a church, and our call to work for full participation in decision making.


