From Pastor Amy's Desk....

He said therefore, "What is the kingdom of God like? And to what should I compare it? It is like a mustard seed that someone took and sowed in the garden; it grew and became a tree, and the birds of the air made nests in its branches."

I have been thinking about the article since I informed Session I had accepted a new call to the Manokin Presbyterian Church in Princess Anne, Maryland. (My last Sunday at FPC of Sussex will be June 28th). Then a picture on Facebook came up from a church hike to Tillman Ravine and Buttermilk Falls in 2014 that nudged me down memory lane.

In my six years united with you in God's love and service, we have done a lot together. We have:

- Celebrated the church's 175th Anniversary in grand style
- Organized a mission trip that 17 youths and adults went on
- Rejoiced with the Rev. Casey Carbone, a child of the church, when he was ordained as a Minister of Word and Sacrament in 2017
- Had fun together on hikes, canoe and rafting trips down the Delaware River, snow tubing, baseball games, and senior gatherings and outings
- Continued and deepened our relationship with Presbyterian Mission partners from Iraq
- Entered a partnership with NORWESCAP, where our parking lot is used as a bus stop for the Head Start program
- Developed a Manual of Operations and Handbook for Ministry Groups
- Baptized 12 infants and two adults
- Conducted three confirmation classes and confirmed 17 youth
- Strengthened our relationship with Family Promise as we continue to be a key church in this ministry
- Helped Session and the church know and understand our financial assets and challenges
- Continued our involvement in our community through the Sussex Help Center and the Just Plain Change Ministry

As I look back over the years and memories, it's not so much the big events I will remember the most. It will be the quiet and ordinary moments of ministry together. It will be the home communion visits with the deacons, meeting with the children before Sunday School, collaborating for worship, the hospital and hospice visits, the moment in worship when we share the joys and concerns of our hearts with each other, the meals we have shared together that will rise up in my heart and mind.

It's the small, ordinary things that the larger events of our life sit upon. You did the small, ordinary things well before I got here, and you will continue to do them well when I leave. It is these small, faithful things that God uses to make a big difference in our lives and in the world. It is these small, faithful disciplines and practices that have helped us navigate well this season of COVID-19 and will allow you to navigate a change in pastors as well.

Session Highlights

Session met on May 19th. The following items were discussed:

- We currently have an active membership of 122.
- Our church continues to hold church services on Sundays at 10:30 a.m. via the ZOOM platform. Please call Pastor Amy for the "invitation" if you don't already get one.
- A request from Buildings & Grounds to acquire bids to paint the nursery, ceiling pipes in the nursery, and the back stairwell, was approved.
- Chair of the Nominating Committee, Rob Hayzler, continues the search for volunteers for open elder and deacon positions. This process is postponed at this time due to COVID-19, since we will need a Congregational Meeting to elect new elders and deacons.
- It is encouraging to see how many people are keeping up with their pledges by sending in the money or using our new online option. Regarding our 2020 Budget (which is a deficit budget), we are almost on pace for where we, as a Session, though we would be.
- Session discussed questions regarding the re-opening of our building for gatherings. At the time of
 the Session meeting, it was decided to hold a separate meeting when guidelines from the Presbytery
 and State were made available. The Presbytery is starting to hold regional meetings for churches to
 collectively work through the questions of gathering in a safe and caring manner.
- Pastor Amy announced that she has accepted a call and informed Session her last day would be June 30, 2020. God bless and good luck to Pastor Amy. Session approved a week of vacation (June 9-15, 2020), as Pastor Amy's previously-approved vacation in April was cancelled due to COVID-19. Pastor Amy set up a meeting for Tuesday, May 26, 2020, for Session to meet with our COM Liaison, the Rev. Pat Sileo, online, to discuss next steps.
- The next Session meeting will be held online on Tuesday, June 16, 2020, at 6:30 p.m.

The Sussex Help Center is open from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Fridays. They need eggs. The Church of the Good Shepherd Episcopal Church in Wantage needs food donations. Right now they especially need cereals (like Wheaties, Cheerios, and Raisin Bran), pasta and sauces, canned vegetables and fruits, and soups. They are open for drop-offs between 9:00 a.m. and 11 a.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays. They are currently


serving about 200 families. If you know of a family in need, please contact Walter Houck (973-875-7412). **Thank you for your support!**

<u>Family Promise</u>: Despite the shelter being closed, Family Promise of Sussex County has remained open to serve those experiencing homelessness in our community. Currently, their biggest need is food for clients. They would like: canned fruits and vegetables, beans, cereal, peanut butter and jelly, bread, pasta and sauce, macaroni and cheese, applesauce, snacks, soup, rice, toilet paper, paper towels, soap (body, dish, laundry), lotion, shampoo and conditioner. They also have some clients with special dietary needs (diabetic, allergies, etc.). Donations of food can be dropped off at the Family Promise office (19 Church Street, Newton).
