


Pentecost Offering

News of Missionaries The Callisons

Our church is sending a donation to the Callisons for the work they do. Greg and Christine Callison are both Presbyterian ministers working in the north of Iraq, in the Kurdistan region, in a ministry of witness and service to Kurds, mostly of Muslim background. This is a ministry similar to what the Callisons did for many years among the Kurdish refugee and immigrant population of Berlin, Germany.

The Kurds are one of the largest people groups in the world without a country of their own, and, more importantly, without a church indigenous to their culture. The Callisons' work is "Great

Commission" frontier mission work among unreached peoples. Unreached people groups are ethnic groups that do not yet have a church movement in their own language and culture.

Presbyterians have long been interested in the Kurds. After their work ended in the Kurdish homelands of eastern Turkey, northeastern Syria, and lastly, in 1969, in northwestern Iraq, in the mid-1980s, the PC(USA) began to look for where ministry could continue among Kurds in exile. It was discovered that there are half a million Kurds in Germany, with the majority coming from Turkey. The German government invited most of them to come to Germany when they experienced their economic boom and wanted cheap labor. Thus, the Callisons were invited to work in partnership with the German Evangelical (Protestant) Church to engage in a holistic outreach to the Kurdish community there. In 2010, with an invitation from the Iraqi Presbyterian Church, the time seemed right for the work to return there.

Christine was ordained and commissioned for service among Kurds in Berlin in 1987. She brings to this special ministry a unique background of education and experience. A native of Maryland, she earned her undergraduate degree in music education from the University of Cincinnati Conservatory of Music. Her M.Div. degree is from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School in Deerfield, Illinois, where in 1986 she was honored with the seminary's Preaching Award. She is a member of Chicago Presbytery. She earned a German language diploma from the Goethe Institute in Cincinnati and West Germany and studied Kurdish at the Freie Universitat/Berlin. She also taught music in the public schools of Cincinnati, Ohio; taught piano and directed choirs in Cincinnati and Chicago; worked for three years in Europe with Campus Crusade for Christ's music ministry; and directed the senior high program for the Village Presbyterian Church in Northbrook, Illinois.

Of her own faith journey, Christine writes, "As a Christian, I see myself as living every moment of every day by the grace of God - that every breath I breathe, everything I see, hear, taste and am able to do is by God's grace. That a naturally independent sheep like me would be so loved and guided by the Shepherd fills me with unspeakable awe and thankfulness. Life abundant and eternal, what a gift of pure grace, utterly undeserved!" (Chris' birthday is June 30.)

Greg came to this ministry with ten years of pastoral experience in the U.S. He and Christine were married September 2, 1995, after which he was appointed to join in the ministry in Berlin. Greg also had a special interest in the Kurdish people. After the Persian Gulf War in 1991, the church he pastored in Columbus, Ohio made the General Assembly "Commitment to Share Good News," thus "adopting" the Kurds as a special focus for ministry and prayer. His congregation helped a Kurdish family that had fled from the war to resettle in Columbus, and later, hosted a Kurd from Berlin needing to improve his English. In 1992, Greg went to London, England to visit a Presbyterian ministry among the 10,000 Kurds there. During that trip he also went to Berlin, Germany where he first met Christine. The following year Greg went to Kurdistan (eastern Turkey and northern Iraq) to see first-hand part of the Kurdish homeland. In 1995, he was employed by the Presbyterian Frontier Fellowship and traveled around the U.S. sharing about the frontier mission work of the Presbyterian Church.

Greg is a graduate of Westmont College, Santa Barbara, California and obtained his M.Div. from Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena, California. For five years he served as an associate pastor in the Dallas, Texas area, followed by five years pastoring a church in Columbus, Ohio. He is a member of Scioto Valley Presbytery.

Greg describes himself as one "... truly surprised by joy. That this small town boy should be living first in Berlin, Germany, and now in Iraq, reaching out to one of the world's great and fascinating peoples, the Kurds, is a wonder of God's grace. What motivates me is the desire to see Kurds share that same joy, which we know because of Christ. And for Chris and me, the 'icing on the cake' is that we are privileged to share in this ministry with so many wonderful Presbyterians in churches of all sizes across the U.S." (Greg's birthday is December 10.)




Why Per Capita?
