From Pastor Amy's Desk....

"You are the salt of the earth;" (Matthew 5:13a - NRSV)
"You are the light of the world." (Matthew 5:14a - NRSV)



Jesus tells us in Matthew's gospel that we are the salt of the earth and the light of the world. In biblical times, salt was overwhelmingly viewed as a positive resource. Not only does salt add flavor to food, it also preserves certain foods such as meat or fish from spoiling, which was essential before the invention of refrigeration. Salt also helps to purify or cleanse meats through the removal of blood, which is forbidden to be consumed according to the Torah. Finally, salt was useful in healing or cleansing certain ailments. Salt, to put it succinctly, is a necessary element of life. Light is also a necessary element of life as well. Light is necessary to see, for warmth, to grow things. When Jesus tells us that we are salt and light, he is telling us that we are necessary and essential. We are salt and light to the world when we care for those who suffer loss, we seek to do justice, we show mercy, we have integrity, we are peacemakers, and we courageously stand for what we believe.

As we enter the season of Lent, I encourage us to take on the practice of noticing when you have been 'salt and light.' I invite you to notice where God has worked through you to help someone else. Where has God used you to be the essential elements of salt and light? I invite you to not just notice them but to share these experiences. From now until Easter, there will be space in worship where we can share how God used us to be salt and light in the world. There will be a variety of ways to share, so that no one is left out of this experiment. If you aren't comfortable speaking in front of everyone, you can email or text me your experience, and I will share it on your behalf. Also, there will be a space where people can share their experience by writing it down or bringing in a picture that represents your experience.

Jesus tells us that we ARE the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Let us not just go through the motions of our faith, but take notice of when and where God is using us to help others. Let us, through our noticing and sharing, encourage each other to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. Let us attend to the salt and light in us, so that we don't lose our saltiness and our light isn't extinguished.


New Hours


Ecumenical Lenten Study



Family Promise was featured in <u>This Week</u> magazine as their Charity of the Week. This is what they wrote: Since 1988, **Family Promise** has helped homeless families through a three-pronged strategy of preventing eviction, providing shelter, and helping secure a home. The organization's more than 200 local affiliates offer temporary housing in shelters, houses of worship, and private homes, as well as transportation, child care, and connections to local social-service agencies. Family Promise chapters have opened day centers where the homeless can shower and do laundry. The organization's main goal, however, is to help people find housing; it has helped 88 percent of the families in its programs. You can donate directly to local chapters through the **Help Us Move In** (**helpusmovein.org**) program, which matches donations raised locally by Family Promise affiliates. *Each charity we feature has earned a four-star overall rating from Charity Navigator, which rates not-for-profit organizations on the strength of their finances, their governance practices, and the transparency of their operations. Four stars is the group's highest rating.*
