#### From the Pastor's Desk....

Hello Friends and Members,

This month is a jam-packed month for me personally and professionally, since, if all goes to plan, I will be starting my maternity leave on April 1<sup>st</sup>. As I begin my March note, I did want to share the many thanks Donald and I have for the baby shower held for us on February 26<sup>th</sup>.

Thank you for the thoughtfulness of the shower and for the gifts. We're overwhelmed by your support of us as we welcome our first child—a baby girl—into this world. So, thank you, thank you, thank you!

Now, as we journey through Lent together—which began on February 22<sup>nd</sup> – we're looking at how the natural world can inspire us in our faith and strengthen us in walks with Christ. I'm not a gardener. I'm not a plant person... let me tell you, I have the opposite of a green thumb! I have a thumb of death!

The season of Lent is upon us and with that comes the first signs of spring—may you all find comfort and hope during this church season AND earth's season. In the dullness and chill of winter, in the somberness of Lent, we still have reason to hope in the greatest gift and offering ever given to us: Jesus Christ's life, ministry, death, and resurrection.

So, friends, live into that hope and share the light of Christ's love and grace with this world. For we know that come Easter morning, spring will be right around the corner, and the created world will also proclaim the lifegiving joy found in God alone.



# **Ultimate Youth Nights**



## The 40 Days of Lent

Lent is the name given to the period of preparation for the chief Christian festival, Easter. The word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon word *Lenten*, meaning "Spring." Christians have developed various traditions within their respective denominations for the preparation of the great festival season of Easter.

Questions have been raised about the symbolism of this significant season. Why is it 40 days long? Sundays are not counted in the days between Ash Wednesday and Easter. Forty hours were first devoted to this observance in token of the time Jesus spent in the tomb. By the third century, however, this observance had been extended to a 40-day period.

The 40 days have been likened to a number of biblical parallels: Moses' fast on Mount Sinai; the number of years of wandering in the wilderness; Elijah's fast on his journey to Mount Horeb; the 40 days' grace given to Ninevah in Jonah's preaching; and Jesus' fast at the beginning of public ministry.
