From Pastor Amy's Desk....

I am flooded with so many different emotions as I sit down to write this month's newsletter article. I am worried and concerned for our healthcare providers, grocery and store employees, funeral directors, and delivery persons. I am worried and concerned for children and people in abusive situations where home is not a safe space. I am worried and concerned for people that struggle with addictions and how the stress and disruption of routines can jeopardize their sobriety. I am worried and concerned for people that struggle with anxiety and depression. I am worried and concerned for our families that are confined to their homes and yet are expected to work and go to school at the same level of productivity as before. I am worried and concerned for people that have been furloughed and fervently pray they will have a job to go back to after this pandemic.

My heart breaks for all the things this pandemic has robbed from us. My heart breaks for the people that cannot visit their loved ones. My heart breaks for the people who cannot be at the bedside of a loved one who is ill or dying. My heart breaks for all the graduates who will not be able to celebrate this life milestone with family and friends. My heart breaks for the people who put so much work and time into all the spring plays and musicals, concerts, sports, and dance recitals that have been cancelled this year.

My heart is also filled with joy and hope. The fact that so many people are complying with the stay-at-home guidelines shows a concern and love for our neighbor. Yes, we are staying home for our own health, but we are also staying home for the health of our neighbor. I am filled with hope seeing how many people have looked around and have shared from their surplus. Many people have pulled out sewing machines and made fabric masks for people. Others have used their surplus of time to call and check in on each other. Others have chosen to use everything in their pantry and freezer so that they don't have to go to the store as often. My heart is filled with joy at seeing the pictures of our planet experiencing healing while our former ways of being have been halted. My heart is filled with joy hearing people express a new appreciation for things they used to take for granted. My heart is filled with joy by how many people have transitioned and encouraged others to come along as our church has temporarily moved to ZOOM-land.

I think Paul's heart was filled with all the things our hearts are filled with when he wrote to the church in Philippi encouraging them to "stand firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel." It is normal and okay for our hearts to be filled with so many emotions. But this pandemic does not give us permission to toss away the gospel of Christ. In this crisis it is more important than ever to live a life in a manner worthy of the gospel. As you learn and experiment with what living a life worthy of the gospel of Christ means for you at this time, know that you are not alone. Your brothers and sisters in Christ are standing with you as we all strive to live in a way that is worthy of the gospel of Christ.
