From the Pastor's Desk....

Many blessings to you and your loved ones!

We've made it to November! The second-to-last month of the year. The month where I begin to reflect and reminisce on the year and the ways I've seen God's abundant goodness at play within it.

Some years, the list seems to go on forever and ever. Other years, my list seems very short. The reason I do this in November is because my family has a tradition during Thanksgiving dinner: we go around the table and share things we're thankful for.

When I was younger, I thought very much in the moment during this thankfulness sharing. As I got older, I started thinking through the scope of the whole year. And now, I think about it in the days and weeks leading up to Thanksgiving Day.

I certainly know that becoming your pastor is going to be at the top of my "thankful" list for 2021. When my family and I are sitting around our Thanksgiving meal, this wonderful fact will be one of the first I share.

I'm incredibly grateful that God brought us together in this pastoral relationship. I've come to love this wonderful group of people—and I hope you've come to put up with me and my antics without finding them completely annoying (all the time).

For me, music has always been another love of mine and something I'm also grateful to God to have access to. And so, I wanted us to reflect on the words of this hymn: "Let All Things Now Living." If you have access to a computer or smart phone, I suggest playing a recording of it too, so that you have an immersive experience. In our hymnal, it's No. 554.

"Let all things now living A song of thanksgiving To God our Creator triumphantly raise; Who fashioned and made us, Protected and stayed us, By guiding us on to the end of our days. God's banners are o'er us, Pure light goes before us, A pillar of fire shining forth in the night: Till shadows have vanished, All fearfulness banished, As forward we travel from light into Light.

"By law God enforces. The stars in their courses, The sun in its orbit obediently shine; The hills and the mountains, The rivers and fountains, The depths of the ocean proclaim God divine. We, too, should be voicing Our love and rejoicing With glad adoration, a song let us raise: Till all things now living Unite in thanksgiving, To God in the highest, hosanna and praise."

This hymn's lyricist is named Katherine K. Davis, and, to me, she captures the idea of how grateful the created world is for God, and how much we are called to be grateful, too.

Friends, as we look to and through our November calendars, may you remember lots and lots of things to be grateful for since Thanksgiving 2020. May you find happiness with loved ones near or far. And if you're struggling to find any joy, please reach out to me. It would be an honor to be present with you in your sorrow, stress, or depression. I'm always a call or text away.

Happy Thanksgiving! I'm grateful for you—more than you even know. As James 1:17-18 reads in the Message Version of the Bible, "So, my very dear friends, don't get thrown off course. Every desirable and beneficial gift comes out of heaven. The gifts are rivers of light cascading down from the Father of Light. There is nothing deceitful in God, nothing two-faced, nothing fickle. He brought us to life using the true Word, showing us off as the crown of all his creatures." May God's gifts connect you to your loved ones during this time of the year (and always).
