#### From the Pastor's Desk

Hello lovely Sussex Presbyterian folks!

As it is November, I wanted to begin this note from me to you to say how grateful I am to be part of this worshipping community. It is such a blessing to be your pastor and to be a witness to the ministry of this congregation.

At the end of my vacation week last month, Donald and I were talking about how fast and full the end of the year is. November and December are going to fly by faster than we can blink. We already know it just with the things currently on our calendars. And we're certain more things will be added.

I'm guessing the same is true for many of you—as you look toward the end of 2023, you probably also have lots of things already dotting your calendar: perhaps it's travel for Thanksgiving or Christmas or New Year's. Perhaps it's some kind of medical procedure. Perhaps it's tasks to get done before this year ends.

2023 has gone remarkably quickly for me with all the transitions that've occurred for myself personally. Frankly, it's shocking how quickly this year has gone! And how fast the seasons change and shift. So much has happened near and far—war continuing and war breaking out. Unnecessary violence and bickering in all corners.

And this is why, in November, I take time to really be grateful. December is my second favorite month, but my focus isn't on gratitude in the last month of the year—it's on the countdown to the celebration of Christ's birth: our greatest gift.

November, however, with Thanksgiving thrown into the mix, is the month I really try to take time to think back over my many, many blessings. For they are so numerous. Psalm 65:9-13 showcases some of these blessings that will likely resonate with you, too: "You visit the earth and water it; you greatly enrich it; the river of God is full of water; you provide the people with grain, for so you have prepared it. You water its furrows abundantly, settling its ridges, softening it with showers, and blessing its growth. You crown the year with your bounty; your wagon tracks overflow with richness. The pastures of the wilderness overflow; the hills gird themselves with joy; the meadows clothe themselves with flocks; the valleys deck themselves with grain; they shout and sing together for joy."

May we all be grateful for the ways God provides for us, especially in the busyness of the last couple months of the year! That's my prayer for all of us this November.

# Stewardship Sunday



**STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY** is **this Sunday**, **November 5**<sup>th</sup>. Please bring your pledge cards to worship **this Sunday**, and place them in the collection plate; or mail them to our Depositing Treasurer, Janet Hayzler, at 96 Holland Road, Wantage, NJ 07461, if you won't be worshiping in church. Please prayerfully consider increasing your pledge for 2023.

As a main feature of this year's stewardship campaign, the committee shared the various giving trends in our congregation. To do this, the chair of the Committee, Ruling Elder Richard L. Hayzler, created the following chart. This two-part chart combines different levels of giving for the church. There are 7 different levels and they are broken up by weekly giving amounts. Some math is involved for you to place yourself on the chart if you give less frequently than each week. The chart shows how many giving units (individual or family) are in each level, as well as the total contributions given by that specific level. For example, the middle level has five giving units and is made up of those people giving \$38-46 weekly (aka \$152-\$184 in a four-week month). These people pledged a combined total of \$11,068 for the year, which makes up 11% of the church's total revenue budget. 
#### Why Per Capita?


