
Session Highlights

Session met on September 15th. The following items were discussed: HIGHLIGHTS

- The Nominating Committee is looking for volunteers to serve as elders, deacons, and as members of the Nominating Committee.
- Lois Wright has indicated her desire to retire as Chair of the Refreshments Committee. All of us need to give her a big thank you. Thanks Lois!
- A stewardship letter will be sent in the fall that starts our budgeting for 2021. Please pray about this, and be generous.

Re-Entry to First Presbyterian Church of Sussex



Please be aware that we started in-person worship on **Sunday**, **September 27**, **2020**. Please follow the format for re-entry that the Session has laid out. The use of the ZOOM platform will continue if you feel more comfortable watching from home.

- 1. There will be ushers at each of the doors. The ushers will direct you to your pew. The total number present cannot be more than 45, including participants (as of this writing).
- 2. Please enter the church nearest your pew. Please leave following the service using the door nearest your pew.
- 3. Bulletins and offering plates will be at each door for you to pick up and for giving.
- 4. No Bibles or hymnals will be available. All information and hymns will be listed in the bulletin (no congregational singing).
- 5. Sharing of the Peace will be performed at your pew. No handshaking or embracing.
- 6. Masks will be required at all times in the church. This is a recommendation from our insurance company and Newton Presbytery.
- 7. Masks and hand sanitizers will be available at the doors for your use if needed.
- 8. There will be no fellowship hour.
