- 2. Please enter the church nearest your pew. Please leave following the service using the door nearest your pew.
- 3. Bulletins and offering plates will be at each door for you to pick up and for giving.
- 4. No Bibles or hymnals will be available. All information and hymns will be listed in the bulletin (no congregational singing).
- 5. Sharing of the Peace will be performed at your pew. No handshaking or embracing.
- 6. Masks will be required at all times in the church. This is a recommendation from our insurance company and Newton Presbytery.
- 7. Masks and hand sanitizers will be available at the doors for your use if needed.
- 8. There will be no fellowship hour.

Deacons' Fund Offering


A part of the Deacons' ministry is our monthly Deacons' Fund Offering, which assists charitable, nonprofit organizations. The Board of Deacons would like to thank everyone who donated to People Help in July and Local Share in August.

Our Deacons' Fund for September will go to Ginnie's House. Ginnie's House Children's Advocacy Center was opened in the spring of 1998 and is situated in the center of the Town of Newton. The Center is in the historic Park Building, located near the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office, Sussex District Office of the New Jersey Division of Youth and Family Services, Sussex County Judicial Complex, Sussex County Sheriff's Office, and other human services agencies. The building was made available and is maintained by the Sussex County Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Center is available to children in Sussex County who may have been sexually or physically abused, assaulted, or witnessed a violent crime, including domestic violence. It provides a safe, child-friendly environment for child abuse investigations and treatment. It also provides a multi-disciplinary team response to child abuse allegations, working with child abuse victims and other community service providers that include: Law Enforcement, Child Protective Services, Medical & Mental Health Professionals, Victim Advocates, and Social Service providers, to enhance services to child abuse victims and their families.
