From the Pastor's Desk....

Sometimes it feels like the world is coming at us so quickly that we don't know which way to turn, where to look, what to do next. In a chaotic world, we find strength in knowing that God is always near. That's why I'm grateful for *A Season of Peace* we are in, which culminates with the Peace & Global Witness Offering on World Communion Sunday, which is always the first Sunday in October (this year that's **October 3**rd). The ministries of peacemaking and reconciliation witness to the Prince of Peace. It is good to be reminded that with all the discord, pain and conflict in our communities and in the world, we serve a God who promises harmony and responds to violence with reconciliation and peace.



The Peace & Global Witness Offering draws Presbyterians together and provides education and exposure to those who show us how to do this work well. It has helped support our church partners in Lebanon recover emotionally from the trauma after a bombing in Beirut. It helped congregations begin to address the growing mental health crisis and the increase in number of suicides in their communities. And the whole church joined together, through this Offering, to lead a Peacemaking Travel Study to the U.S.-Mexico border, where participants got a greater understanding of the difficult life for many people in Central America and Mexico fleeing from poverty and violence.

This is why we give to the Peace & Global Witness Offering. We give because we know that every level of society is in need of Christ's life-changing, life-giving peace—at all times, in all ways. From our congregation, where we retain 25% of this Offering to promote and support building bridges and peace; to the region, where 25% is given by our Presbytery and Synod to support peacemaking efforts being pursued, together with our neighboring congregations; and to the ends of the earth, where the remaining 50% is used by the Presbyterian Mission Agency to join the peacemaking efforts of church partners all over the globe. We join these monetary gifts with our prayers for peace and our work for justice.

You're invited to visit the Peace & Global Witness website (presbyterianmission.org/peace-global) to find out more information on how your support of this Offering helps. As a community of faith, we want to deepen our commitment to peacemaking so that it becomes a visible and profound witness to our community. I challenge each of us to consider how we might increase our witness and increase our giving to the Peace & Global Witness Offering. If you have any suggestions of local organizations that promote peace work, please let me or another member of Session know, as we discern where God is leading us to share our portion of this special Offering. I pray that the God of Peace might open the generosity in our hearts to join with Christians all over the country on World Communion Sunday, **October 3**rd, in response to the Peace & Global Witness Offering.

As Presbyterians, we claim Jesus Christ as Prince of Peace and pattern our lives in the compassion, kindness and grace that he shows us.

Session met on July 20th. The following items were discussed:

- The church has 121 members (death of Suzanne Hunt on June 20, 2021).
- A water evaluation has been completed by the municipal authorities. Results are forthcoming.
- Our two buildings are undergoing an update of need regarding electricity and plumbing per insurance regulations.
- The Session has voted to provide residence for Pastor Katherine's mother from September 2021 to September 2022.
- The neighbors across from the manse are utilizing the parking lots for their own uses. A letter will be written by our lawyer, Jennifer Kovach, to "cease and desist." A rental procedure will be written by Ruling Elder Jason Touw.
- All 9th graders will be contacted for the purposes of an interest in a confirmation class.
- Our income for June was higher than other months. Please continue this trend, and thank you!
- Special music will be provided on August 1, 2021. Choir rehearsals are being scheduled.
- The ZOOM platform and in-person attendance will continue until the end of this year. This decision will be re-evaluated at the time.
- The next regular Session meeting will be held on **Tuesday**, **September 21**, **2021**, at 6:30 p.m.


Can You Help?


Our Deacons' Fund for September will go to the Ginnie's House. Ginnie's House Children's Advocacy Center was opened in the spring of 1998 and is situated in the center of the Town of Newton. The Center is in the historic Park Building, located near the Sussex County Prosecutor's Office, Sussex District Office of the New Jersey Division of Youth and Family Services, Sussex County Judicial Complex, Sussex County Sheriff's Office, and other human services agencies. The building was made available and is maintained by the Sussex County Board of Chosen Freeholders. The Center is available to children in Sussex County who may have been sexually or physically abused, assaulted, or witnessed a violent crime, including domestic violence. It provides a safe, child-friendly environment for child abuse investigations and treatment. It also provides a multi-disciplinary team response to child abuse allegations, working with child abuse victims and other community service providers that include: Law Enforcement, Child Protective Services, Medical & Mental Health Professionals, Victim Advocates, and Social Service providers, to enhance services to child abuse victims and their families. <u>Upcoming Event</u>: September 9-13th – The Moving Wall at Woodbourne Park. The Wall of Remembrance in Washington, DC, remembers our servicemen who died in Vietnam. From **September** 9th-13th, a replica of the wall, "The Moving Wall" will be at Woodbourne Park in Wantage, with a 9/11 ceremony on **September 10**th at 7:00 p.m., and a Grand Opening at 2:00 p.m. on **September 11**th.

The Moving Wall is the half-size replica of the Washington, DC, Vietnam Veterans Memorial and has been touring the country for 30+ years. When John Devitt attended the 1982 dedication in Washington, he felt the positive power of "The Wall." He vowed to share that experience with those who did not have the opportunity to go to Washington. John, Norris Shears, Gerry Haver, and other Vietnam veteran volunteers built The Moving Wall. It went on display for the first time in Tyler, TX in October of 1984. Two structures of The Moving Wall now travel the USA from April through November, spending about a week at each site.
