From the Pastor's Desk....

First off, I wanted to say congratulations to all our graduates! You've made it through another milestone in your life! May God continue to bless your path, wherever it leads next, through more schooling or into the work force. God is always with you and so is the love from your church family. Congratulations!

A few months ago, I was given a little book called *God is a wonder: bedside inspirations to nourish your spirit* by Gwendolyn Hayes. I must admit that I haven't spent a whole lot of time with this small, yellow, sunshiny book. But what I have read has been simple and thought provoking.



It's not a book I would have picked up on my own, but I'm happy to have it now that I do. Perhaps you have something like this book in your life. A gift that you wouldn't have selected yourself but has become something meaningful to you.

And when we think about it, we have a gift that we didn't work to receive or put on our birthday/Christmas lists. We have the gift of God's never-ending love. This love is so powerful and so worthwhile, that God came down to earth as a fragile and tiny baby for us. Jesus Christ came into this world and changed the way we humans related to our Creator.

This summer, as we enjoy time outside (hopefully) and longer days, I hope you make time to develop your relationship with God. Whatever you decide to do, I hope this summer is a great one for your relationship with God and your community. I leave you now with Romans 12:9-18:

Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all.

May you find a deeper connection with God this summer. And may that deeper connection to our loving savior bring you a new sense of peace and trust.






Sunday School News
