Hello Friends and Members of Sussex Presbyterian!

Perhaps it'll even inspire you to create your own statement of faith (just like I ask all confirmation students to do at the end of their confirmation class). That sounds like it could be a fun... or at least thoughtful... summer activity. Perhaps on those days when the thunderstorm changes your plans at the last minute?

May you enjoy your summer, and I'm looking forward to seeing you again soon! I'd love to catch up—maybe over coffee/tea, lunch, or a walk—so if that's something you'd like, too, we can set up a time!




Summer Sermon Series

Sunday school runs from 9:30 – 10:15 a.m., for Pre-K through Adult, September through June. Please see Ashley Ziccardi if you have any questions.


Sunday School for 2023-2024 will start on **Sunday, September 10**th.

Per Capita exists as a way for all Presbyterians to share costs that belong to the whole church and to give meaning to the interdependent nature of Presbyterian polity. For 2023, each member's contribution is \$42.50.

It exists to allow the whole church to share equitably in those things that make us Presbyterian: our theological identity, our connectedness as communities of faith, our core structures that keep us together as a church, and our call to work for full participation in decision making.
